The University of Victoria's English Language Centre is looking for qualified and experienced English as an Additional Language Teachers to teach in our August programs.

Qualifications: Teachers MUST have TESL Canada-recognized certification standards. These include having the minimum of a Bachelor's degree and specific TESL certification (e.g. CELTA or a post graduate diploma in Applied Linguistics from a post-secondary institution that has a minimum of 100 hours of instruction and 20 hours of practicum). In addition, teachers should have a minimum two years EAL teaching experience with adult learners.

Teaching overview: As a unionized environment, we hire new teachers after everyone on our seniority list has been offered work. Positions available are between 3 to 4 weeks long in August 2026. Classes typically run Mon - Fri, 8:30 - 12:30. The students are adults, with the average age being 18 -- 25. There are weekly meetings and a final certificate celebration on the final day of the program.

Compensation: The pay per classroom hour is \$57.40 and this includes preparation time.
