Summer Arts Series: Call for Proposals from UVic Fine Arts Alumni, Sessional Instructors and Graduate Students

The Division of Continuing Studies, in partnership with the Faculty of Fine Arts and Alumni Relations at the University of Victoria, is looking forward to offering the third edition of the Summer Arts Series. Our theme for 2024 is **Art and the Urban Landscape.**

Art appears in the urban landscape in a variety of ways, transforming our experience of the world and the way we engage with one another. The Division of Continuing Studies invites proposals from UVic Fine Arts Alumni, sessional instructors, and graduate students for the delivery of workshops and lectures for the 2024 Summer Arts Series. These non-credit workshops are for working professionals in arts careers as well as interested members of the public looking to gain new knowledge, skills and explore the creative process.

Focused on the theme of art and the urban landscape, sessions can range from hands-on workshops to lectures, offered online or in person. Providing short, immersive learning opportunities, proposals can include half-day, full-day, or 2-day workshops utilizing resources on campus or in the community as required.

We are looking forward to receiving proposals in all five areas of fine arts: Art History and Visual Studies, Music, Theatre, Visual Arts and Writing. Some sample topics are:

- Using urban spaces as a stage
- Public art walking tours
- Urban soundscapes
- Art interventions
- Creative placemaking

In order to keep our fees reasonable for our community learners, we are able to offer a rate of \$100 for each instructional hour, or \$200 for a 1.5 hour lecture. Sessions will be scheduled in the first two weeks of July 2024.

Instructor requirements

Applicants should:

- Be fine arts alumni, sessional instructors or graduate students from the University of Victoria;
- Have excellent interpersonal, communication, and facilitation skills;
- Instructional experience with adult learners is considered an asset.
