

USING MY ACCOUNT + FIND YOUR CLASS





You can use your My Account page to learn what classes you are registered for online! Here's how:

- Go to uvic.ca/elc.
- Click the **SIGN IN** button in the topright corner of the page.
- Log in using the **Netlink ID** and password you made for yourself before you came to Canada.
- 4 Select **Courses**.
- 5 Select **Current Courses**.
- Your information will be online by 8:00pm on the first day of your program.

Can't remember your Netlink ID?

Don't worry! First, try checking your email - UVic probably sent you an email to confirm your Netlink ID a few weeks ago. If you can't find it, all you need to access your Netlink ID is:

- Your full name
- Your date of birth
- Your ONECard's V Number

YOUR UVIC ONECARD



Your ONECard is your UVic identification



You can use it to buy things on campus



You can also use it to ride public buses in the city

You will get your ONECard during your campus tour! You can use it for many things, including:

- Buying food at University Food Services and UVSS Food Outlets
- Riding public buses anywhere in Victoria
- Access to CARSA, UVic's campus gym
- Purchases at the UVic Bookstore

- Paying for printing at ZAP Copy in the Student Union Building
- Borrowing books from the McPherson Library
- Paying for printing at the McPherson Library

Loading money onto your ONECard

To put money on your ONECard so you can use it across campus, visit the ONECard office in the University Centre. You can also load money online at uvic.ca/onecard!

Lost your ONECard?

It's okay! First, freeze your card at <u>uvic.ca/onecard</u> so no one can spend your money, then visit the ONECard Office at the University Centre. If it has not been found and returned, it will cost \$20 to replace.








Your Program Calendar shows basic information for every ELC event - this will help you plan for activities weeks in advance! You can check your calendar online at uvic.ca/elc/current-students.

To purchase tickets in person, you will need your **ONECard**. You can pay with cash or credit card. Please note that all sales are final and we cannot offer refunds!

















THE BUS LOOP + CAMPUS SECURITY





The Bus Loop (also called UVic Exchange) is the final stop for all Victoria public buses that travel to UVic. From this location, you can travel to almost any Greater Victoria neighbourhood: Downtown, Oak Bay, Saanich, Esquimalt, Langford, Sidney and more!

If you want to go downtown, all of the bus stops in the Downtown Terminal beside the UVic Bookstore (Bus Stops A - H) will take you there. Buses that go to other Greater Victoria locations usually depart from the McKenzie/Gordon Head Terminal, which is next to the Student Union Building (Bus Stops L - R).

Campus Security

Keeping UVic safe

If you get hurt, feel unsafe, or see anything suspicious while you're at UVic, call Campus Security at **250-721-7599**. Their office is by the Bus Loop - open 24 hours a day, 7 days a week!

Lost and Found

If you lose an item at UVic and it hasn't been returned to the ELC's Student & Financial Services area, it might be in Campus Security's Lost and Found. Visit or phone during daytime hours!



JAMIE CASSELS CENTRE







UVic's Jamie Cassels Centre is home to many different and useful areas for ELC students.

It is located directly across Ring Road from the Continuing Studies Building. Here, you can:

- Get on private charter buses outside the building entrance for ELC trips going to Butchart Gardens and Vancouver
- Purchase lunch and snacks at the many different food outlets in Mystic Market
- Ask any questions you have about UVic at the Welcome Centre
- Buy tickets and enjoy performances at the Farquhar Auditorium

The ONECard Office



The **ONECard Office** is located on the first floor of the University Centre.

Here, you'll receive your ONECard student identification on your campus tour.

You can also come to the office to add funds to your card, or to replace your card if it has been lost.

EATING ON CAMPUS

There are many places where you can buy food and sit down to eat on UVic's campus! Below are five locations that accept cash, debit, credit card and ONECard:



The Cove Inside "Building 1", next to the SUB

The Cove has 10 food kiosks which include vegan, vegetarian, no-gluten and no-dairy options.

Mystic Market Inside the Jamie Cassels Centre

Mystic Market contains many different restaurants and lots of tables for eating!

BiblioCafé Inside the McPherson Library

Closed for the summer.







UVSS Food Outlets Inside the Student Union Building (SUB)

The SUB has a grill, health food bar, coffee shop, and more!

Starbucks Beside the Bus Loop

The only Starbucks that accepts ONECard!

And those are only five of UVic's many food outlet locations! For a list of every place to eat at UVic, and information like store hours and specials, visit **uvic.ca/services/food**.

Felicita's Campus Pub, SUB

This is a great place to enjoy food, drinks, and entertainment! In addition to its bar and table-side service, Felicita's frequently hosts local bands and fun community events like Karaoke Night.

You must be the legal drinking age (19 or older) to enter, and will need to show a **government issued ID.** Felicita's is **unable to accept ONECard as ID or payment**, so make sure you come prepared!



THE STUDENT UNION BUILDING









The **Student Union Building** - called the **SUB** for short - is a building full of businesses run by UVic students.

Some of the most useful places in the SUB for ELC students are:

- The UVSS food outlets, where you can buy health food, grilled food, pizza, snacks, coffee, soda, and more!
- The **Vertigo Lounge**, a great place to eat with plenty of seating and tables
- **ZAP Copy**, a store where you can print your documents and assignments
- The **Post Office**, where you can send mail
- **Heart Pharmacy**, where you can buy medicine and other pharmacy items

Cinecenta Movie Theatre



Cinecenta is the campus movie theatre. Located in the SUB beside the Bus Loop entrance, this is a great place to see all kinds of films for a great price!

Cinecenta is also where you can find the **Munchie Bar,** a small shop where you can buy coffee, snacks, and sandwiches, as well as - of course - popcorn!

CAMPUS COMPUTERS + PRINTING









Computers

If you need to use a computer, you can find many available on the first floor of the **McPherson Library.** You can log into any of these computers with your **Netlink ID** and password (see Page 4).

The **Learning Centre** also has some computers that you are welcome to use for English homework! However, the Learning Centre does not have a printer.

Printing

The McPherson Library has four print stations. Black & White printing is **\$0.12 per page**, which you pay for using your **ONECard** (see Page 5). You can access these print stations from any library computer - if you need help, library staff are happy to assist you!

ZAP Copy

ZAP Copy is another place you can print your documents and assignments. It is located in the Student Union Building.

Like the McPherson Library, you always use your **ONECard** to pay for printing at this store - a ZAP staff member can help you set up your account if you need assistance.

At ZAP, printing is a little less expensive than at the library: Black & White printing is only **\$0.10 per page**!



CAMPUS GYMS











CARSA

CARSA is UVic's Centre for Athletics, Recreation, and Special Abilities. ELC students are part of the gym's **ALL IN Fit and Climb** package, which includes full access to:

- The CARSA fitness weight centre
- The CARSA rock climbing centre
- Reservations for group fitness classes
- Drop-in times at the field sport house
- Free tickets to Vikes games and events
- And more!

You must sign a waiver before you can use any of CARSA's facilities. Please make sure you do so the first time you visit the gym.

The fitness centres require indoor running shoes and the climbing wall requires climbing shoes (you can rent climbing shoes at CARSA).

You can check online for drop-in times and book group fitness classes at **activeliving.uvic.ca**.

McKinnon Gym

Your CARSA membership also includes access to the McKinnon fitness centre and pool!

The McKinnon gym is located between CARSA and the UVic Bookstore. See Page 15 for visual directions.

To use a locker at the McKinnon gym, remember to bring your own combination lock!



MULTIFAITH SERVICES










Multifaith Services seeks to foster community while providing religious and spiritual support and spiritual care for the students and staff at the University of Victoria.

Multifaith Services can offer:


- Prayer and meditation groups



TAKING THE BUS IN VICTORIA







Your **ONECard** allows you to ride on any BC Transit bus while in Victoria. Here are some helpful tips for taking the bus:

- Plan to arrive at the bus stop a few minutes early.
 Buses often don't arrive exactly on schedule, and might leave without you if they are a little early.
- When you first get on the bus, swipe your ONECard across the top of the farebox to be allowed on.
 Please DO NOT INSERT your card into the farebox like paying with cash - it will destroy your ONECard!
- Press a red STOP button (or pull on one of the yellow cables along the bus windows) to let the driver know you want to get off at the next bus stop.
- The seats at the front of the bus are called courtesy seating. You are welcome to sit there, but if a senior citizen or someone with a wheelchair or stroller needs a seat, please offer these chairs to them.

Planning Your Trip

When you take the bus, knowing where to go is very important! You can plan your trip on your phone with free applications like **Next Ride** or **Google Maps**.

Safety Stops

If you ever feel unsafe, you can ask the bus driver to let you off between regular bus stops.

Please ask your driver at least one stop ahead of where you want to get off.

MEDICAL INSURANCE + HEALTH CLINICS





All students at the English Language Centre have paid the **UVSS Student Services Fee**. This means that you have **guard.me** medical insurance coverage for the duration of your studies with us.

This plan covers medical services required to address new and unexpected illness or injury. More information is available at **continuingstudies.uvic.ca/uvcsguardme**.

Find a Health Clinic

If you need to talk to a health professional in person, go to **guard.me/uvcs**, select **Find a Canadian Clinic**, and follow the easy instructions. The website will bring up a list of available clinics close to you! **DO NOT** go in person until you have made an appointment online or by phone.

Using the mobileDOCTOR App

If you are feeling unwell, you can use the **mobileDOCTOR** app from anywhere, for immediate medical advice. This app offers confidential video consultation to international students 24/7.

Be prepared for an unexpected illness by downloading the **mobileDOCTOR** app and following the steps at <u>guard</u>. <u>me/uvic/mobileDOCTOR</u>. You will need your policy number and date of birth.

Submit an Insurance Claim

In some situations you will need to pay the clinic and then submit a claim to **guard.me** to be reimbursed for eligible services. Visit **guard.me/uvcs**, select **Submit a Claim** and follow the easy instructions!

PERSONAL SAFETY



Canada is a wonderful place to visit and study - a peaceful and friendly country. But it is always better to be safe than sorry, so here are some tips to help you stay comfortable and safe:

- Never leave your items alone in a public space
- When you go out, plan ahead! Know where you are going and how to get there
- If someone is bothering you, don't worry about their feelings - tell them to stop!
- When you go out at night, go out with friends
- You can always ask Canadian police for help they are friendly and professional
- In an emergency, call 9-1-1.

Don't be Fooled by Scams

Some people may try to trick you into giving them your money / personal information over the phone or online. Use this advice to protect yourself:

Talk to someone you trust first. Before you transfer money or information, you can ask your homestay parents or a CA if you are worried. If an email from a friend seems strange, don't reply - ask them about their message another way.

Research online. If a company wants something from you, look up their company name and address online along with "scam" or "fake." You can see if other people have been tricked.

COUNSELLING

Sometimes, being in a country far from home can be challenging. It is always okay to ask for help!

At the English Language Centre, free and confidential counselling services are available for you to see someone who will help you.

Common reasons students might need counselling support include:

- Missing home
- Feeling sad, angry, lonely, or upset
- Going through a difficult time
- Having a family emergency

Student Immigration Advising

Are you a temporary resident in Canada and have immigration questions related to your study program?

We have a Regulated International Student Immigration Advisor (RISIA) available to answer your questions.

Common reasons students might need immigration assistance include:

- Want to stay in Canada longer
- Need to extend their current study permit
- Need to travel outside of Canada and return
- Want to work during the program of study



Making an Appointment

If you want to speak with our **Student Support Coordinator** or the **Student Immigration Advisor**, you can schedule an appointment

To make a meeting, visit the **Student** & **Financial Services** area and talk to one of our friendly receptionists. Their office is located on the 2nd Floor of the Continuing Studies Building.
