Salary Range: is per 1.5 unit course and as of May 1, 2021 is \$6600 to \$8070 per course and is evaluated based on education and experience.

Qualifications:

- Bachelors, Masters, and Doctoral degree holders, or equivalent range of experience in Indigenous language revitalization/reclamation and linguistics through Indigenous life experience;
- Excellent interpersonal, communication, and facilitation skills;
- Previous teaching experience with both non-traditional and professional adult learners;
- For online instructors, experience and comfort with online teaching and/or learning is required, including using online learning platforms

- The course(s) or topics for which you would like to be considered (a list of courses can be found on CILR program website – link above) and months or dates you would be available to teach between September 2023 – August 2024. Note: As we have a special topics course within our program, prospective instructors are also encouraged to include any other topics in specific areas of expertise they might want to teach about.
- Your interest (and experience) in teaching online and/or in-community (Note: in-community courses may require travel expenses which would be covered by the program)
- The CILR program works with community partners to co-identify instructors, if you are connected with any particular Indigenous communities/languages, please identify this in your application

Application Deadline: Courses may be scheduled during the Fall 2023, Spring 2024, and Summer 2024 terms and do not typically follow standard university term dates. All courses are 39 instructional hours: in-community courses often run as 6-day intensives; online courses are often scheduled over 6 or 12 weeks.

Applications will be reviewed starting August 1, 2023.
