SUMMARY OF DUTIES AND RESPONSIBILITIES

SJS100 is an interdisciplinary examination of different approaches to social justice, focusing on key concepts, theories and debates in the field of social justice studies.

REQUIRED QUALIFICATIONS AND EXPERIENCE

Priority will first be given to graduate students enrolled in the Department of Sociology's graduate program, in accordance with Appendix A Appointment Priority Policy. This CUPE 4163 Component 1 position will be paid at the Senior Assistant rate. This position requires excellent writing and communication skills, as well as sensitivity to the diverse needs of the undergraduate student community. Grading at the university level is considered an asset. Graduate students holding sessional appointments are excluded.
