The Micro-Certificate in Teaching English as a Foreign Language is designed for EFL teaching professionals who are non-native speakers of English. ADMISSION REQUIREMENTS

The intensive nature of our program requires potential candidates to:

- be international, non-native English-speaking education professionals with a current teaching or leadership assignment
- hold or be in the process of obtaining a first degree or a teaching certificate from an accredited university or post secondary institution
- fluency in English: TOEFL score of 530 (iBT 71);
 IELTS 5.5 6 or equivalent; or a document supporting their participation in the program by their district administration plan
